

## Processing on Endeavour continues for next launch



## KSC, CCAFS reaching out to employees for Fire Prevention Week



▲ **Shuttle Update:** Technicians have completed leak checks on Endeavour's auxiliary power unit (APU) No. 3 and fuel line disconnects on APU No. 2. The orbiter's ammonia servicing is also complete. The STS-108 Crew Equipment Interface Test concluded last week. Workers have installed Endeavour's waste containment system and conducted main engine leak checks. Engine heat shields are being installed.

◆ **Pollution Prevention Awareness - Material Safety Data Sheet:** *Every chemical used at KSC must have a material safety data sheet (MSDS).* An MSDS provides physical data, toxicity, health effects, first aid, reactivity, storage, disposal, protective equipment and spill/leak procedures of the chemical. An MSDS is designed to provide both workers and emergency personnel with the proper procedures for handling or working with a particular substance. KSC employees can find the MSDS for any chemicals that are stored at KSC at the following
