Expedition 2 crew to give presentation of their activities on Space Station

▲ **The Expedition 2 Crew** -- Jim Voss and Susan Helms – will be at KSC today (Oct. 16) to talk about their work aboard the International Space Station. Their presentation is scheduled from 10 - 11 a.m. in the KSC Training Auditorium. Employees are encouraged to attend, with permission from supervisors.



▲ **ISS Update:** Expedition Three Pilot Vladimir Dezhurov and Flight Engineer Mikhail Tyurin ventured outside the newly outfitted Pirs Docking Compartment for the second time in two weeks and made

their way to the nearby Zvezda Service Module to install a series of experiments to study the impacts of long-term exposure to the harsh environment of space. During the spacewalk, Expedition Commander Frank Culbertson monitored and helped choreograph the work of his Russian colleagues and provided television views of their activities from inside the outpost. Culbertson and Dezhurov are scheduled to perform a third spacewalk Nov. 5 to complete outfitting the Pirs, which serves as both a docking port for future Russian vehicles arriving at the space outpost, and as an airlock for Russian segment spacewalks.

◆ **Astronaut Hall of Fame Adds Four:** Former Shuttle commanders Robert L. "Bob" Crippen, Joe H. Engle, Richard H. "Dick" Truly and Frederick H. "Rick" Hauck are America's first class of Space Shuttle astronauts being inducted into the U.S. Astronaut Hall of Fame, joining space heroes from Mercury, Gemini, Apollo and Skylab missions. The induction ceremony will take place at 2 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 10, at the KSC Visitor Complex's Shuttle Plaza. Scheduled master of ceremonies is CNN's Miami Bureau Chief John Zarrella; host is Jim Lovell. *A special rate is available for badged KSC personnel and up to four guests at \$52 for adults/children. This discount is available only when tickets are purchased in person at the KSC Visitor Complex ticket plaza.* Package price includes admission to the Friday evening pre-induction celebration and the Saturday afternoon induction ceremony, as well as admission to both the KSC Visitor Complex and the Astronaut Hall of Fame for three full days, Nov. 9-11.
